Classes are taught at all skill levels by internationally-renowned teachers. A needlepoint exhibit is open to the public, as is a shop offering needlepoint supplies and a bookstore featuring an array of needlework books and publications.
- **LOCAL CHAPTERS** – Participation at the local level offers special opportunities to learn, get to know other stitchers in your area, and share your efforts with a most appreciative group. A special *Chapter Project Book* is developed every two years, containing a wide range of projects that only chapters can undertake. Please note that chapter dues are set locally and are in addition to national dues.

 - **Judging Certification** – prepares the candidate for the rigors of professionally judging needlework shows
 - **Master Needle Artist Certification** – tests the design, color and stitching skills of a candidate based on research and historical study
 - **Needlearts Appraisal Program** – trains candidates to become professional, independent appraisers of needlework
 - **Master Teacher Certification** – offers training and certification on five levels: Journeyman, Fellow, Professional Fellow, Master, and Senior Master
